About Aerodynamics Inc. (ADI)

ADI is a full-service FBO based at the Oakland County International Airport in Waterford, MI (PTK). The company opened as a general aviation FBO in 1959 selling Piper aircraft, and later became a Beechcraft dealership. Over the years, ADI's major business areas have expanded to include aircraft interior refurbishment, a Raytheon and Pilatus factory authorized aircraft and avionics service center, aircraft sales & line service, aircraft management & charter services, and corporate shuttle management.

ADI currently manages and operates 17 aircraft for private owners, on-demand charters and scheduled corporate shuttles, and are a certified Supplemental Airline under FAR Part 121 and an On-Demand charter operator under FAR Part 135. ADI operates 34 scheduled corporate shuttle flights per week on aircraft ranging in size from a Jetstream 41 to an Airbus 319.

What an ADI intern will learn

As an ADI intern, you can spend one semester earning college credits as you gain experience in Part 91, 135, and 121 flight operations assisting managers in Corporate Publications, Crew Training, Maintenance Inspection or other aviation related departments. Additionally, appropriately rated interns are occasionally afforded the opportunity to fly second-in-command on select FAR Part 91 flights. The ADI internship is an \$8.00 /hour paid opportunity, and is available to sophomores, juniors, and seniors.

Although we enjoy a low turnover rate, our flight operations business has been expanding rapidly over the past few years and we have been hiring talented individuals to fill new positions. After completing an ADI internship, you will receive top preference to interview for job openings as they come available, although this does not guarantee employment, as ADI hires the most qualified person for all positions.

Applicants should have strong computer skills, including knowledge of Microsoft Word, Excel and Powerpoint, the ability to quickly learn other software applications, familiarity with Federal Aviation Regulations and strong communication and organizational skills.
