INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this publication is to consolidate the publicly available information concerning collegiate aviation scholarships in one document. It is expected that university aviation student, students' parents, and staff members, as well as prospective students and their parents, will find the information in this document useful.

In all, the publication describes how to obtain applications for a total of 777 collegiate aviation scholarship awards in the total value of \$1,214,975. These scholarships are categorized in the following manner:

The publication also includes listings of loan programs that may be available to aviation students. Additional tables are included in the appendix which provides quick reference for scholarship deadlines.

NOTES ON COLLEGIATE FINANCIAL AID IN GENERAL

The total number of scholarships and the amounts of scholarships listed in this document, while impressive, are a very small part of the total financial aid possibilities available to college aviation students. Other sources of financial aid that are available include:

- (1) Federal and state grant scholarship and loan programs:
- (2) Collegiate institution-supported grant, foundation, tuition-waiver, scholarship and student-work programs; and
- (3) Departmental scholarships available to specific majors.

In order to gather information on these and other possibilities for financial aid, all college aviation students should:

- (1) Contact the financial aid office(s) of the institution(s) they are attending or wish to attend.
- (2) Complete the “Single File” “FAFSA” and any related institutional applications. This should result in a financial aid “package offer” combining all of the forms of aid for which you are eligible. Note that many institutions have incentive scholarships for highly qualified first-time applicants (freshmen and/or transfer students).
- (3) Contact the department within the university you plan to attend to determine if there are any scholarships, flight instructor positions or paid internships available through them.

Purpose: The primary purpose of the Airports Council International – North America Commissioners Roundtable Scholarship is to provide financial support to students working toward a career in Airport Management or Airport Administration.

Scholarship Criteria: To be considered you must: (1) Be officially enrolled in an accredited college or university in an undergraduate program focused on a career in Airport Management. Other majors will be considered if an applicant's goal to be an airport manager can be demonstrated through work experience or a personal essay. (2) Possess a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale or the equivalent. (3) Must reside and attend school in the U.S., Canada, Saipan, Bermuda, U.S. Virgin Islands or Guam. The following criteria will be used to evaluate applicants. (1) Application form must be accompanied by an official transcript. Copies will not be accepted. (2) Two letters of recommendation with one from a former/current professor. Both letters must be sealed and submitted with the application. (3) Demonstrated economic need. (4) A 250-500 words essay with an emphasis on the applicant's interest or experience in the aviation industry.

Special Notes: Previous scholarship recipients may reapply for annual scholarships by completing number one and number two of the scholarship criteria for the evaluation section. The essay should provide the Scholarship Committee with information about you that is not contained in another part of the application.

Description: This program was instituted in the fall of 1977 and now presents thirty scholarship awards annually as follows, provided worthy candidates are available: \$2,000 each to one or more college sophomores, \$2,000 each to one or more college juniors, \$2,000 each to one or more college seniors.

Note: It is further planned to perpetuate this scholarship award by continuing the \$2,000 yearly awards for the deserving sophomore and junior recipients (until completion of their senior year), and by presenting additional new awards each year as funds permit, to deserving college sophomores, juniors, and seniors.

Scholarship Criteria: The following eligibility requirements shall be met by applicants for the AIAA Foundation Undergraduate Scholarship Awards: Applicant must have completed at least one (1) academic quarter or semester of full-time college work. Applicant must have a college grade point average of not less than the equivalent of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Applicant shall be enrolled in an accredited college or university. Applicant does not have to be an AIAA student member in good standing to apply, but must become one before receiving a scholarship award. Applicant's scholarship plan shall be such as to provide entry into some field of science or engineering encompassed by the technical activities of AIAA. Applicant shall not have, or subsequently receive, any other scholarship award which, when combined with the AIAA Foundation award, would provide a stipend greater than their tuition plus educational expenses (such as books, lab fees, etc.) estimated by the educational institution he/she plans to attend. Sophomores and juniors who receive one of these awards are eligible for yearly continuation of the awards (until completion of their senior year) provided they maintain at least the equivalent of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, have excellent references, and submit well defined aerospace/aeronautical career goals. It should be stressed that regardless of GPA, renewal is not automatic. To apply for renewal, an individual must submit a completed application, career essay, official transcript and two (2) letters of recommendation. At least one of these letters must be from a professor from the student's university or college. Applicants must be either U.S. citizens or permanent residents of the United States.
