Graduates of this option may also qualify as a National Certified Counselor (NCC). If so, they must meet NBCC criteria and take the NCC exam administered by NBCC **ONLY**. It is recommended that candidates for licensure AND NCC take the NBCC administered exam.

* This option is accredited by the Council for the Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP). It can also lead to license as a Professional Counselor. Upon graduation a person can apply for a Limited License. A "full" license is granted after 3,000 hours of post Master's work experience (supervised by a Licensed Professional Counselor) and passage of the National Counselor Examination (NCE).

** These courses should be taken as early in the program as possible. It is suggested that they be the first courses taken.
