

The Dean's Scholarship



The Office of Admissions will automatically consider all entering freshmen for this scholarship, so there is no additional application. The Dean's Scholarship is based on full-time enrollment of at least 12 credit hours per term.

To be eligible, you must enroll the fall term immediately following high school graduation.

The Dean's Scholarship

A scholarship for first-time students

- ◆ **Early deadline**
- ◆ **Merit-based**
- ◆ **Nonrenewable**

This award is given to students who compete in the Medallion Scholarship competition, but do not receive a Medallion Scholarship. Should you qualify for more than one First-Time Student Award, you will receive only the scholarship with the highest value.

The Office of Admissions will automatically consider entering freshmen for this award, and invite all eligible students to compete in the Medallion Scholarship Competition on January 24, 2009. To qualify for an invitation to compete, participants must meet the following requirements:

- First-time, domestic, undergraduate degree seeking student, entering WMU for fall 2009
- 3.7 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale at the end of the junior year

The Award

- ◆ **\$3,000 or \$6,000**
- ◆ **Split evenly between fall and spring only**

- ACT composite score of 26 or higher, or a combined score (math + critical reading) of 1170 on the SAT
- Complete admission application file (application, high school transcript, ACT or SAT score(s), and application fee) received in the Office of Admissions by **Dec. 5, 2008**

Of those students who are invited to participate in the Medallion Scholarship Competition, 17 students will receive a Medallion Scholarship. All other qualifying students will receive one of the following Dean's Scholarships:

- \$6,000 total over two years (Medallion finalists)
- \$3,000 for one year (all remaining competitors)

The award will be paid in equal amounts in fall and spring semesters.
