GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR SED MAJORS:

1. Minimum of 36 hours in history.
2. Maximum of 9 hours at the 100/200-level or two-year institution transfer.
3. Minimum of 18 hours at the 400/500-level. Departmental approval for directed teaching requires grades of “B” or better in at least 6 hours of history courses numbered 420-489 or higher.
4. Minimum of “C” in all required course work
5. At least two approved courses in American Indian history or culture, United States women’s history or women’s studies, African-American history or culture, or Hispanic-American history or culture. These courses may be included in the history major and/or social studies minor and/or humanities cognates if selected from appropriate disciplines.
6. All required course work at the 300-level or above must be completed within ten years of commencing a directed teaching assignment.
7. Social Studies Minor – 24 hours.
