(Charters or other documents-most with seals, of Richard II, Duke of Normandy, c.1025; William the Lion, of Scotland; David Earl of Huntingdon (c.1172), with Medieval cuir cisele seal-box; King John, Edward I, Edward III, Henry VI, Queen Elizabeth I and St. Augustine's Abbey, Canterbury; and the archive of 792 Vellum Charters of the Priory of St. Thomas of Stafford; an Archive of Debts to Cardinal Wolsey and Thomas Cromwell; letters from the Papers of Robert Beale and Sir Francis Walsingham; Manuscripts of Leslie's Historie of Scotland, Spenser's State of Ireland, Sir Thomas Smith's Discourse of the Commonwealth and Sir Kenelm Digby's Journal of His Piratical Voyage; autograph MSS. Of Thirlby's Embassy to Rome, 1555.)
1968 25 June	Bibliotheca Phillippica. New Series. 4 th Part. The Celebrated Collection of Manuscripts formed by Sir Thomas Phillipps, Bt. (1792-1872). (Bulls of Innocent II, Celestine II and Alexander III to the Abbot of St. Bertin; a ninth-century document associated with Nonantola; the cartulary of Sta. Croce in Campese; letters of Cardinal Ippolito Aldobrandi (Pope Clement VIII); an unrecorded early text of Basinio's Liber Isottaeus; an interesting Latin poetical miscellany and an important Italian Miscellany including Poliziano's Stanze per la giostra and Orfeo and Marc' Antonio Epicurio's Cecaria; an important series of eight letters from Francesco Vettori to Machiavelli; and the extensive collection of manuscripts formed by Count Vincenzo Ranuzzi of Bologna (c.1650-1726); Greek MS., including Giorgio Antonio Vespucci's copy of St. Basil's homily on reading pagan literature; a manuscript of Machiavelli's Il Principe preceding the editio princeps.)

- 4 July Bibliotheca Phillippica. New series, 8th part. Italian and Greek Manuscripts and English Charters (Ammonius's treatise on words, fifteenth-century; four MSS. Copied from Guillaume Pelicier, Bishop of Montpellier, 1539-42; an unknown verse epic on the War of Cyprus, Corfu, 1652-3; and a group of the notorious forgeries by Constantine Simonides; Charters of the twelfth and thirteenth centuries granting land in Cheshire, Wiltshire, Gloucestershire, Hertfordshire, Kent, Lancashire, Norfolk, Suffolk, Northamptonshire, Nottinghamshire, and Yorkshire; a Bull of Pope Adrian IV, correspondence of a fourteenth-century Venetian merchant; Letters of Cardinal Georges d'Amboise, Janus Lascaris, Niccolo Capponi and Henry VIII; despatches from Florence to Francesco Vettori during his German Embassy; the Diplomatic Archive of Pierfrancesco Portinari as Ambassador in England; and letters from learned men to Scipio Gentili, 1588-1615.)
- 25-26 June Bibliotheca Phillippica. New series, 9th part. (Letters of Louis XI, Catherine des Medicis, Cardinal de Lorraine, Henri III, Louise de Lorraine, Henri IV, and Charles, Duke of Schomberg; Naval and diplomatic letters from Louis XIV and Louis XV to members of the d'Estrees family.)
- 26-27 Nov. Bibliotheca Phillippica. New series, 10th part. Sir Thomas Phillipps, Bt. (1792-1872.) Books printed in England and of English books printed abroad before 1641. (A-F.)
- 24-25 June Bibliotheca Phillippica. New series, 11th part. Sir Thomas Phillipps, Bt. (1792-1872.) Books Printed in England and of English Books Printed Abroad (G-Q.)

(The first and second Shakespeare folios; Hugh Rhodes, Stans puer ad mensam, J. Redman, before 1540, the only known copy; Whittington's Vulgaria, Wynkyn de Worde, the 1524 and 1533 editions; Fitzherbert's The Booke of Husbandrye, c.1555, the only known copy; John Hamilton's The Catechisme, 1552, the first book printed in St. Andrew's.) (R-Z and Addenda.)
- 8 July Bibliotheca Phillippica. New series, 14th part. Italian, Greek, Russian, Polish and Lithuanian Manuscripts. (Letters of Cardinal Frederico Borromeo, of Cardinal de Granvelle concerning preparations for the Lepanto Campaign, of the last Duke of

Urbino to Claudia de' Medici, Princess of Urbino, and from the Vettori Papers.)

Holingshed, 1581, and a document relating to Nonsuch Palace, 1591.)
