## ALAN SIEBERT

As a soloist, Siebert has performed throughout much of the United States in a variety of settings. He has also performed and recorded as a member of Summit Brass, Carillon Brass, Kentuckiana, and the San Diego Brass Consort. A firm supporter of new American music, he has commissioned and premiered many new works for solo trumpet and mixed brass ensembles. Hornpipes (Trumpet/Organ duo) has performed through much of the United States, and has recorded on the Integra label.

In addition to his performance activities, Siebert has taught on the faculties of the University of Bridgeport, University of Wisconsin-Superior, Arizona State University and Michigan State University. He is co-author of *Teaching Brass*, published by McGraw-Hill, now in its second edition. A graduate of the University of Michigan and SUNY Fredonia, Siebert has recorded for Equilibrium, Pro Arte, Discovery, New World, Summit, Klavier, Integra, Rodgers, and Coronet.

## SANDRA RIVERS

Sandra Rivers has concertized throughout the world, including Canada, Germany, Italy, Spain, the Netherlands, Switzerland, Portugal, Russia, Bermuda, Puerto Rico, Hong Kong, the People's Republic of China, Taiwan, Japan, South Korea, and extensively across the United States. Rivers has appeared at the Mostly Mozart Festival, Tanglewood, the Schleswig-Holstein Festival, Aspen, the Kennedy Center and on the Great Performers Series at Lincoln Center. She has worked with such noted conductors as Arthur Fiedler, Anshel Brushilow, Jean Morel, Isaiah Jackson, Michael Morgan, and Keith Lockhart. In addition to her solo career, Rivers has become widely known for her concert partnerships with many of the world's leading soloists including Itzhak Perlman, Kathleen Battle, Kyung-Wha Chung, Anne Akiko Meyers, Elmar Oliveira, Cho-Liang Lin, Joshua Bell, Sarah Chang, and Nadja Salerno-Sonnenberg among others. Her collaborations with Nadja Salerno-Sonnenberg and Sarah Chang have twice taken her onto the Tonight Show with Johnny Carson and with Jay Leno.

Rivers is a Steinway Artist and has recorded for EMI/Angel, CBS Masterworks, RCA Victor Red Seal, Teldec, Pony Canyon, Musical Heritage, and Zafiro.

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
