All music majors fulfill the Baccalaureate-level writing requirement by taking MUS 3520 NonWestern Music. This class should be taken in fall or spring of the junior or senior year as a General Education elective. Beginning with the Fall semester of 2005, all College of Fine Arts students must fulfill the Computer Literacy requirement with MUS 1140 Digital Media in the Arts.

Prior to the Fall semester of the Third Year (or before beginning music education methods courses or 3000-level courses in the College of Education), students need to have completed the following:

\_\_\_\_\_ Completed 35 hours or coursework

\_\_\_\_\_ Have an overall GPA of 2.5

\_\_\_\_\_ Completed all Intellectual Skills requirements ( if needed - ENGL 1000, MATH 1090, ED 1040)

\_\_\_\_\_ Completed Proficiency I College-Level Writing course

\_\_\_\_\_ Completed ED 2500 Human Development with a "C" or better

\_\_\_\_\_ Passed the Basic Skills Test (information is available at [www.mttc.nesinc.com](http://www.mttc.nesinc.com) – test is given in October, January, April and July – register well in advance).

\_\_\_\_\_ When all of the above are completed, submit an application to the College of Education Advising Office – 2504 Sangren Hall. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis, but should be submitted prior to the fall semester when you wish to begin methods.

\_\_\_\_\_ Completed the music core in theory/history/aural comprehension and conducting; all must be completed with a "C" or better, and you must have at least a 2.5 GPA in theory/aural comprehension/history classes:

Basic Music 1600, 1610, 2600, 2610

Aural Comprehension 1620, 1630, 2590, 2650

Music History 1700, 2700, 2710

Conducting 2150

\_\_\_\_\_ Have no grade of less than "C" in Applied Music and successfully completed the Sophomore Hearing

\_\_\_\_\_ Submit an application to the music education area by January 15<sup>th</sup> (prior to the fall semester when you wish to begin methods – applications are available in the Music Advising Office)
