The Healthcare Services and Sciences (HSS) General major is designed to prepare students to work in variety of health careers:

- Students who want to prepare for administrative and other non-clinical positions in the complex and varied career area of health care.
- Students who plan to attend graduate school in a clinical or non-clinical career.
- In addition to the general HSS major, specific concentrations are available to students:
 - o HSS Blindness and Low Vision Preparation Concentration
 - HSS Clinical Practice in Health (Degree completion for students already working in health care who hold associate degrees or certificates in health-related areas.)
 - o HSS Occupational Therapy Preparation Concentration
 - o HSS Physician Assistant Preparation Concentration

Admission Requirements:

 Students admitted to WMU and in good standing are eligible to major in Healthcare Services and Sciences. Grade restrictions apply for continuing in the major.
