


## **SPECIAL ACTIVITIES**



#### **SEMINAR WEIRD SCIENCE**

The activities described on these pages are in addition to your regular class schedule which for most students involves classes between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Commuting students are reminded that they may attend all of these special activities, but that except for performances, their attendance is optional. Special commuting student instructions are found in bold italic type. We hope to have volleyball, ping pong, and billiards equipment as well as table games available for check out from the Hadley Hall reception desk for use during your afternoon and evening free time.

### 10 Sunday

#### **Arrival and Registration**

Registration begins at noon in Hadley Hall (our residence hall). To minimize waiting, students are invited to arrive alphabetically as indicated below (but you can register as soon as you arrive):

**Testing and Auditions** 

All students must be seated in the Dalton Center Recital Hall at 2:15 p.m. Students will need the following at this session (not every item applies to every student):

- ♪ Instrument (for the audition)
- ♪ Music folder (received at registration)
- ♪ Pencil (will be provided in the Recital Hall)
- ♪ Audition music (if applicable)

If you are auditioning for the elective jazz class, be sure to bring the necessary music/instruments. After taking the music theory placement test and indicating your elective class preferences, you will move on to your audition(s). After auditions, you have free time until 6:15 p.m.

**Meet & Greet Supper** 

Please plan to return to Hadley Hall after your audition, and be there no later than 6:15 p.m. At that time the counseling staff will begin taking groups of students from Hadley to the Seminar Dining Room for supper. We have been assigned the Valley Dining Center. This meal is for all students (including commuting students).

**Orientation Meeting** 

All students (including commuting students) must again be seated in the Dalton Center Recital Hall at 8 p.m. for a General Orientation Meeting. When this meeting adjourns, all students (including commuting students) will return to Hadley Hall for Counselor Meetings (ensemble and class assignments).

#### **Counselor Meeting**

Resident students will meet with their assigned counselors. *Commuting students will meet with the counseling supervisor*. The location for each meeting will be announced at the 8 p.m. session. Each student will fill out his/her own class schedule card.

When this card is approved, commuting students may leave for the evening (circa 10:30 p.m.).

#### **College Information Session** (optional)







#### Official T-Shirt Day (recommended)







39th Annual Masquerade Ball (optional)


