



Research Data Fiscal Year 2020-21 (FY 2021)

Executive Summary

- Despite the uncertainties faced throughout this fiscal year, the research data for FY 2021 reflects recovery and advancement.
 - The number of proposal submissions was lower than in FY 2020, while the overall value of FY 2021 submissions exceeds the pre-pandemic amounts of FY 2019.
 - Federal sponsors continue to account for the vast majority of proposal submissions. However, FY 2021 shows growth in submissions to state sponsors.
 - A comparable trend is seen in Awards, with fewer awards but higher dollar value. FY 2021 surpassed FY 2020 by 20.5% and is only 2.9% down from FY 2019 totals.
 - The latter half of the fiscal year saw expenditures outpacing the same period of FY 2020. Overall, expenditures were down 1.1% from FY 2020.
 - Year-end F&A percentage for FY 2021 is greater than the prior year and even greater than FY 2019, which was pre-pandemic.




Proposal Submissions

Number of Proposal Submissions

Compared with FY 2020, there were 15.5% fewer proposal submissions in FY 2021.


Year-over-Year Comparison Number of Proposal Submissions



Value of Proposal Submissions

Despite fewer submissions, the total value of Q4 FY 2021 submissions exceeded that of FY 2019 (prepandemic). The value of FY 2021 submissions is 10.4% less than FY 2020.


Year-over-Year Comparison

Proposal Sponsors

Federal agencies continue to be the dominant sponsor type. However, in FY 2021, we saw a rise in the number and value of state and foreign proposal submissions.


Value and Number of Proposal Submissions by Sponsor Type



Submissions to Federal Sponsors

Submissions to the **U.S. Department of Education** had the highest dollar value, although there were four times as many submissions to the **National Science Foundation**.


Top 10 Federal Funding Sources



Proposal Submissions

Submissions by the College of Education and Human Development had the highest dollar value, while the College for Engineering and Applied Sciences submitted the most proposals, with the College of Arts and Sciences close behind.








Awards

Number of Awards


WMU received more awards in Q2 and Q3 FY 2021 than in the same periods in FY 2020. Overall, 5.5% fewer awards were received in FY 2021 compared with FY 2020.


Year-over-Year Comparison Number of Awards



Value of Awards


Although fewer awards were received in FY 2021, award values for FY 2021 surpassed FY 2020 by 20.5%. The overall value of FY 2021 awards was just 2.9% less than of FY 2019 awards (pre-pandemic). The overall FY 2021 F&A percentage also increased over FY 2020.





Award Sponsors

Awards are predominately from **federal** sponsors. More awards were received from **state** sponsors in FY 2021 compared with FY 2020.



Award Sponsors

The value of awards from federal and state sponsors increased substantially in FY 2021. Most other funding sources stayed steady. However, Foundation awards declined after posting higher amounts in FY 2019 and FY 2020.

Note: FY2019 numbers include some federal and state awards that covered multiple years (i.e., an entire \$5 million award received upfront rather than in annual increments).



Expenditures

Expenditures

Expenditures in the last half of FY 2021 increased over FY 2020 by \$3.3M, with year-end totals for FY 2021 just 1.1% less than FY 2020.

FY 2021 Indirect/F&A percentage has ticked up from prior years.
