What makes someone eligible for services from the military office at WMU?

If an individual is currently serving or has ever served in the military, they are eligible for services. If a student's parent or spouse has EVER been in the military, they are considered a military dependent and are also eligible for services.

Do I qualify for in-state tuition?

Has your parent or spouse EVER served in the military? If so, you qualify for in-state tuition. The Office of Military and Veterans Affairs would need the following paperwork: Service member's DD-214 and student's birth certificate.

Are there military scholarships available?

WMU has several military-specific scholarships open to all categories of military students, including military dependents. There are scholarships that award in both the fall and the spring semesters.

How accepting are you of military credit?

WMU is constantly refining its process of evaluating military credit to ensure we can grant you the credit you deserve. In that, understand that we will only give you credits that can be applied to your degree. Your advisor will be the resource in helping you determine if those credits will fit.

APPLYING FOR BENEFITS

GI Bill: (Post 9/11, MGIB, CH1606) VOC Rehab, DEA www.va.gov

Post 9/11 Eligibility percentage

- 910 to 1,094 days (30 to 35 months): 90% of the full benefit
- 730 to 909 days (24 to 29 months): 80% of the full benefit
- 545 to 729 days (18 to 23 months): 70% of the full benefit
- 180 to 544 days (6 to 17 months): 60% of the full benefit
- 90 to 179 days (90 days to 5 months): 50% of the full benefit

WHEN TO APPLY

WMU: a year before you'd like to attend
GI Bill: ASAP (it takes 30 days to process).

MINGSTAP: up to 14 days after the semester starts

FTA: up to **8 days** before the class starts. *Must be complete and approved before the start of class no (ETP's).*

FAFSA: within the application window before you start school

Documents to turn in

- VA certificate of eligibility
- DD-214 --cover SSN and email
- Veteran certification form
- Birth certificate (dependents)

WMU Admissions accepts:

- All transcripts and/or JST's
- Documents to claim in-state tuition
