- Office for Sustainability's initiative for non-motorized transportation education, advocacy and policy efforts
 - Weekly Open Bike Shop
 - Mobile fix-it
 - Broncobikes
 - Has lead workshops and community group rides, conducted non-motorized research

Weekly Open Bike Shop

- Visitors will repair their own bikes with the guidance of student mechanics
- Tools and bike stands available free of charge
- Keeps common parts on-hand for a small fee (tubes, chains, brake pads, cable, housing)
- Open 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. every Friday at the Office for Sustainability

- Free

BroncoBikes

- Low cost, campus-wide bicycle rental program
- \$75 per semester
 - \$25 refunded when bicycle is returned in good condition
- Helmet and U-Lock come with each rental

Past Projects and Initiatives


- Best practice research to guide University policy and planning related to pathways, bike lanes, ingress/egress, signage, etc.

Data analysis: Overall Bike Shop Attendance




Semesters with atypical Attendance: Spring 2017 to Summer 2018

Data analysis: Percent 1st Time Attendance




- Unreliable data from 2017

Data analysis: Per Semester Break Down




• Summer attendance trending down, fall attendance peaked Fall 2018
