BENEFITS OF DIVERSITY IN NURSING STUDENTS

- Ethnic differences in morbidity and mortality
- Cultural understanding of diseases and health behaviors
- * Communication skills for patient centered care
- * Bring diverse ideas, opinions, talents

POTENTIAL BARRIERS TO GRADUATION

- * Rigorous program- academically underprepared
- Social isolation
- * Family support, role models
- * Financial- time to work vs. time to study

- * How this works:
 - + Establish a Student Initiated Plan (SIP)
 - + Scholar- Navigator meet 2-3 hours per week
 - + Successful completion of the semester \$300

EVALUATION

- * Two semesters completed
- * All 9 scholars were successful
- * Two students failed who did not accept the offer to be a Scholar
