- An application to the upper professional level must be completed after the following requirements are met:
 - Achievement of passing scores on Basic Skills Examination (BSE)
 - Completion of a background check from <u>CastleBranch</u> (https://portal.castlebranch.com/wc48)
 - Completion of all intellectual skills development courses (if needed)
 - Successful completion of a College Level Writing course
 - Completion of 60 credit hours with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- All Secondary Education program courses as listed below require a "CB" grade or better.
- An average GPA of 3.0 must be earned in ED 3000, ES 3950, SPED 4290, LS 4050, ED 4060, ED 4065, ED 4085, ED 4086, and the Methods of Teaching course(s) for internship and recommendation for the teaching certificate.
- Courses must be taken in sequence and all prerequisites met as indicated.
- Upper professional level education courses can only be repeated one time.
