### **Important Attendance Policy Information**

Attendance at orientation (Aug 22-24) and on the first day of class (Aug 29) is mandatory for all new students.

If you have an emergency and will not arrive in Kalamazoo for the first day of orientation, please contact thomas.marks@wmich.edu or call (269) 387-4800. **Students who arrive late may not be able to study.** 

All students (new and returning) who are unable to arrive on time should understand the following:

- 1. They must notify the CELCIS director and receive permission to arrive late.
- 2. Late arrival for ANY reason may have a negative effect on the student's progress during that semester.
- 3. ALL students who begin classes after the start of the semester, for any reason, will be counted absent for the classes they have missed.

### Travel to Kalamazoo

CELCIS suggests that students arrive 1-2 days before orientation to rest and adjust to the time change.

### By air

Plan to fly directly to the Kalamazoo/Battle Creek International Airport (airport code: AZO). Chicago and Detroit are about three hours away by car.

**Free Airport pickup**: Transportation from the Kalamazoo Airport will be provided FREE for four days before the start date of orientation and two days after. Look for the WMU sign near the Leisure Limousine transportation desk in the baggage claim area of the Kalamazoo Airport to request transportation. You may also call them at 269-343-0848.

- If you arrive BEFORE August 21, tell the taxi driver the name of your hotel. You will have to pay for the cost of the hotel.
- If you arrive ON OR AFTER August 21, tell the Leisure Limousine driver your name and your residence hall room assignment. The driver will call Residence Life, and a staff person will meet you at the door of your residence hall.

### By bus or train

If you arrive in Kalamazoo by bus or train you can arrange for transportation to WMU's main campus by calling a taxi. Two options:

### **WMU Apartments**

### WMU Residence Halls

WMU Residence Halls provide safe on-campus housing and opportunities to meet other WMU students.

Housing contracts begin Sunday, August 26, 2018.

 Students may move into their residence hall beginning at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, August 21 at an additional cost. If you are moving into the residence halls before housing contracts begin, the fee will be \$40.00 per day.



- Linens are NOT provided in the residence halls. Students must provide their own pillow, sheets, blankets, and towels. You will need twin extra-long bed sheets for WMU's beds. If you do not bring linens with you, basic linen packets (sheet and towel) are available to rent for \$5 at your residence hall for temporary use. To request linens, you must contact <a href="rel-info@wmich.edu">rl-info@wmich.edu</a> before arrival. Basic linen packets will not automatically be provided. You must ask for your linen packet from the housing staff when you arrive at the residence hall.

### Arrange to Stay at a Local Hotel

If you arrive BEFORE August 21 OR you do not have housing when you arrive, you will need to stay in a hotel.

It is recommended that you make a hotel reservation **before** you travel to Kalamazoo.

#### **Comfort Inn Hotel**

WMU provides a free daily shuttle service to campus for students from the **Comfort Inn** hotel during orientation. The shuttle service picks up students at the hotel door between 7:30 - 8:30 a.m.

Tell the Comfort Inn staff that you are a new WMU international student to receive a discount. Reservations can be made at the Comfort Inn website, by phone, or by sending an email.

# Western Michigan University Tobacco-Free Campus Policy

Effective September 1, 2014, the use of tobacco products is only permitted in enclosed personal vehicles. ### Tuition refund dates

Complete payment of tuition is expected from all students by the first week of class. If you need to withdraw from CELCIS classes, your tuition may be refunded according to the deadlines.

### Important notice to F-1 and J-1 students

An I-901 fee for F-1 students of \$200 and J-1 students of \$180 has been implemented by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. The fee must be paid and fully processed prior to your visa interview. Please read all immigration documents carefully. By signing your copy of the form I-20 or DS-2019 and accepting your U.S. visa, you agree to all terms and conditions set forth by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. Website.

### Note: International students may experience delays at U.S. ports of entry

As of May 2, 2013, due to heightened security, U.S. Customs and Border Protection officers are verifying the status of F-1 and J-1 nonimmigrants in the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System before admission at port of entry. As a result, it has been reported that many students and exchange visitors are referred to secondary inspection, where their SEVIS record will be reviewed. Due to these new entry procedures, F-1 students and J-1 exchange visitors entering the United States should plan to spend potentially a couple of hours in the secondary inspection process and plan flight connections accordingly.
